### *Hoxworth Blood Center Offers Scholarships*

Hoxworth Blood Center is offering several scholarships to graduating seniors attending high schools in Southwestern Ohio, Southeastern Indiana, and Northern Kentucky. Applicants must excel in the following categories: academics, community service and school related activities. A qualification essay of 250 to 300 words must be submitted on the topic: "Innovative Ways To Turn High School Students into Loyal Blood Donors."

In 2010, Hoxworth Blood Center awarded six scholarships to graduating seniors: Dominique Schiano, Anderson High School; Caitlin Knox, Cooper High School; Kevin Kroeger, LaSalle High School; Sarah Kreuzjans, Notre Dame Academy; Alexander Walter, Milan High School; and Jonathan Brigham, Ryle High School.

The Malcom P. Adcock Memorial Scholarship is available to a graduating minority senior who is attending a high school within the Hoxworth service area and will be enrolling in college as a

full-time student the following fall as an undergraduate to study in the designated fields of: Health Professions, Public Health, Health Research, Nursing or related fields. A qualification essay of 250 to 300 words on the topic: "Why More Minority Blood Donors are Needed in Our Community" must be submitted with the scholarship application.
